
## **Recap on First Camp**


- Scandinavia's largest campsite chain with 44 destinations
- Owned by PE fund Norvestor since 2016, and management
- Revenues of SEK 381 mn in 2019, EBITDA-margin of 27%
- Sales through own website approaching 40%, other sales channels:
  - Contact center (phone)
  - Drop-ins at campsites
  - Online Travel Agents
  - B2B





### Overview - Swedish market





## **Overview of seasonality**


Revenue per month

## Several major actions taken to mitigate Covid-19 situation

#### **Cost-related actions**

- All investments paused in mid-March
- Reduced staff levels (at campsites and centrally) April-August
- Reduction of maintenance costs
- Strict purchasing policy
- Flexibility to the cost base incl. staff agreements

#### Other key actions

- Updated routines for securing healthy
  & safe facilities at destinations
- Sales & marketing initiatives including cooperation with Apollo, Reseguiden.se, and ICA
- Frequent dialogue with authorities and industry associations (no closed campsites, unlike what happened with ski resorts and amusement parks)



## Latest update on Covid-19 situation

#### Sweden


- Recommendation not to carry out "unnecessary" travel lifted on June 13
- Still some restrictions on crossborder travel to/from some countries, including Norway
- Recommendation of maximum 50 participants
- State aid package incl. compensation of parts of fixed cost for revenue loss of at least 30% March-April

#### Denmark

- Previous restriction demanding minimum 6 nights booked for international guests lifted
- State aid package incl. compensation of parts of fixed cost for revenue loss of at least 35% March-June



## Revenue development



#### Q2

- First full quarter with Covid-19 effects; booking inflow dropped by ~50% in mid-March and then recovered, especially after Folkhälsomyndigheten's announcement that recommendation to not carry out unnecessary travel was lifted on June 13
- Drop primarily driven by almost zero international guests, which typically account for 25% of Swedish market

#### July

- Booking situation gradually improving during summer
- Lack of international guests partly compensated by more Swedish guests, especially in cabins

- Pro-forma net revenues, adjusted for acquisitions, decreased with 31% compared to previous year (81.7 MSEK vs 118.6 MSEK)
- The IFRS16 effect on EBITDA for the period was 5.2 MSEK
- Financial expenses for the period include 2.9 MSEK interest on Right of Use Liabilities in accordance to IFRS16
- Pro-Forma Adjusted EBITDA in the quarter amounted to 5.2 MSEK (23.9). Half of the revenue decline was offset by net cost reductions

- Minor changes in fixed assets during the quarter
- Increase in Buildings and Land, and Equipment compared to 2019-12-31 driven by closing of the four Danish acquisitions.
   PPA allocates excess value to Buildings & Land (no material Goodwill increase)
- Continued inventory buildup in preparation for summer season
- Decrease in Account Receivables compared to last year due to Klarna implementation at Nordic Camping & Resort (summer 2019)

- Increase in Deferred Tax Liability compared to 2019-12-31 due to Danish acquisitions
- 45.6 MSEK of debt in the Danish acquired companies repaid during the quarter
- Seasonal increase of Customer Advances from previous quarter
- YoY increase in Customer Advances partially driven by new Danish acquisitions and reclassification from Other Current Liabilities

- Positive effect from change in net working capital of 53.6 MSEK. The seasonality effect on customer advances contributed with 49.5 MSEK in positive cash flow during the quarter
- Cash flow from investing activities amounted to 19.9 MSEK related to maintenance, improvement, and expansion projects at the destinations
- During the quarter, the remaining external debt in the acquired Danish companies (45.6 MSEK )was repaid
