### **Recap on First Camp**

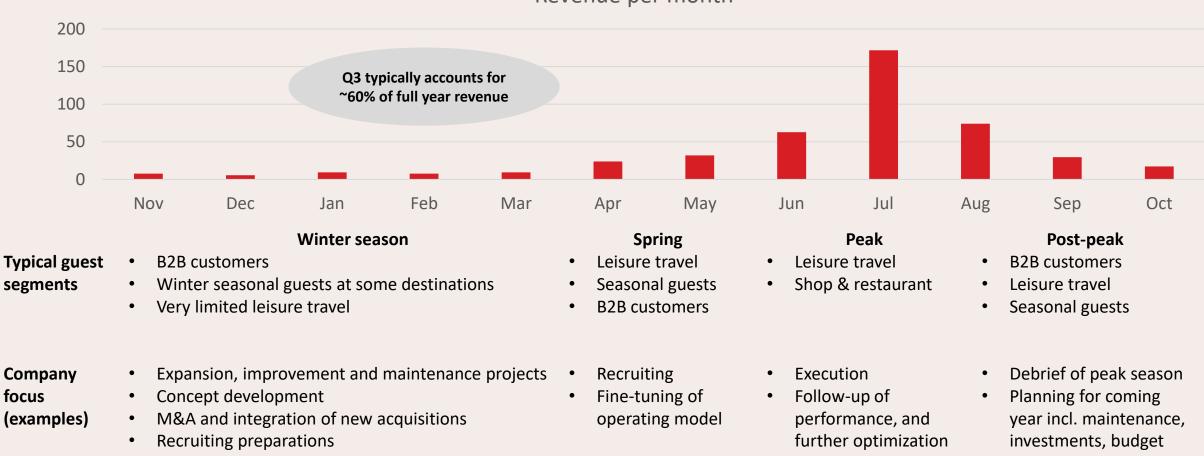
- Scandinavia's largest campsite chain with 61 destinations (as of today) of which 50 in Sweden, 9 in Denmark and two in Norway
- Run-rate annual revenues of 1+ bn SEK including recent acquisitions
- One of the Swedish sites, Leksand Resort, is owned and operated outside of the bond structure in First Camp Group AB
- Owned by PE fund Norvestor since 2016, and management
- Leading position in digitization and firstcamp.se is the largest booking channel in Scandinavia for camping and cabin stays
- The camping industry is highly fragmented; approx 2200 campsites in Scandinavia of which only ~70 belong to a chain

## Highlights of the quarter

### Highlights Q3 2022

- Pro forma revenue increase for the third quarter in 2022: +12%<sup>1)</sup> compared to Q3 2021
- Strong international and domestic demand in Sweden, but weaker domestic demand in Denmark
- MSEK 14 cost increases from energy prices
- Increased guest and employee satisfaction vs. previous year

### **Key financials for the quarter**

- Total revenue of MSEK **610.3** (291.6)
- Pro forma revenue of MSEK **610.9** (543.8)
- Pro forma Adjusted EBITDA of MSEK 306.8 (297.5)
- Cash flow from operating activities
  MSEK 66.8 (53.2)

## Segment development in the quarter

### **Sweden**

- Pro forma revenue increased<sup>1)</sup> with +23% (79.1 MSEK) compared to last year
- Normalized demand from international guests, and maintained strong demand from domestic guests
- Pro forma Adjusted EBITDA increased<sup>1)</sup> with MSEK 38.2 compared to last year – 49% of revenue increase

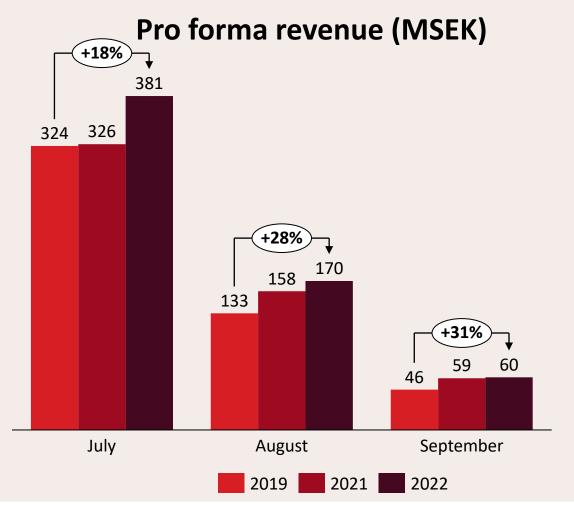
### Denmark

- Pro forma revenue decreased<sup>1)</sup> with 6% (11.9 MSEK) compared to last year
- Weakened domestic demand
- Pro forma Adjusted EBITDA decreased<sup>1)</sup> with MSEK 22.9 MSEK compared to last year
- Margin pressure from energy prices salary and general cost inflation

### Q3

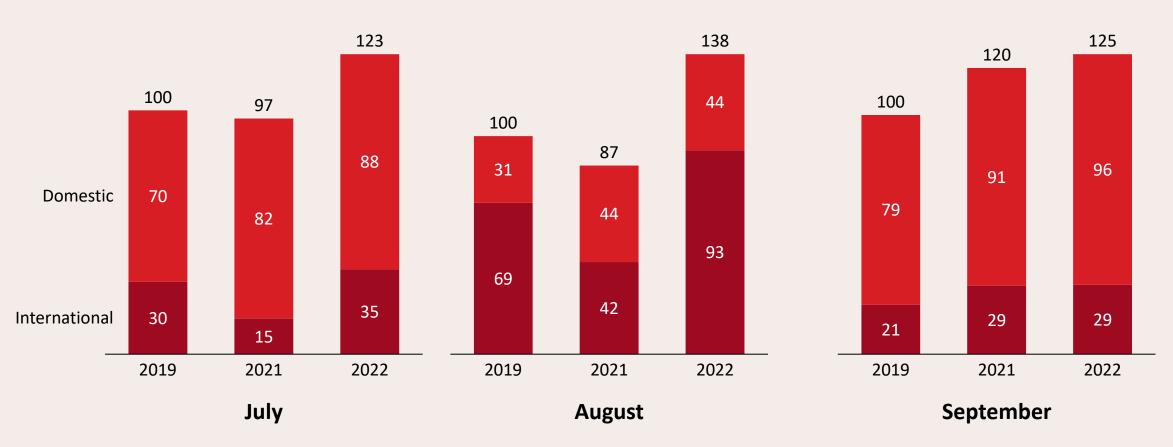
- 21% revenue increase compared to pre-pandemic 2019
- International guests return to Sweden
- Weaker demand development in Denmark and Norway compared to last year, but 15% increase vs 2019
- Investments in improved product incl. Yessi kids club at more destinations
- Successful expansion projects
- Good effect from implementing dynamic pricing on acquired destinations

Swedish destinations owned 2019-2022





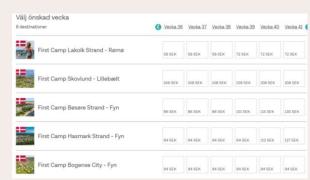
## **Product-related highlights**

#### Quarter

- No effect from government Covid-19 support in the quarter (no impact in the previous year)
- Increased energy prices impact EBITDA with approx. 14 MSEK
- The IFRS16 effect on EBITDA for the period was 7.2 MSEK
- The IFRS16 effect on EBIT for the period was 2.6 MSEK
- Financial expenses for the period include 2.9 MSEK interest on Right of Use Liabilities in accordance to IFRS16
- Net financial expenses reduced by positive effect from recognized price gain in the bond tap issues in the fourth quarter of 2021 and a positive currency effect on group internal loans

- Reduction of pre-payments, accounts payable and accrued salaries
- Cash flow from investment activities attributable to expansion, improvement, and maintenance investments
- Reduced overdraft utilization
